Vanderbilt Sports Medicine is excited to offer its annual Student Athletic Training Conference for 2009. This two-day conference is for high school students or 2009 graduates interested in increasing their knowledge of Athletic Training, Physical Therapy, or related sports medicine profession.

Featured this year will be a dissection of the ankle performed by a Vanderbilt Orthopaedic Surgeon. Students will first learn about basic anatomy of the ankle, common injuries and treatment, and then take a look inside the human body.
