- ◆ Demographic and Administrative Information
  - \_\_\_ Patient name, address, phone number(s), social security number, DOB
  - \_\_\_ Referring physician's name, address, phone and fax numbers, office contact person
  - \_\_\_ Primary care provider's name, address, phone and fax numbers, office contact person
  - \_\_\_ Primary and secondary insurance information (policy holder's name, insurance company name, address, phone number, case manager's name, phone and fax numbers).
  - \_\_\_ Copy of insurance cards (FRONT AND BACK)
  
- ◆ Laboratory Data
  - Does the patient have a known/suspected liver or pancreas mass? If so, send any scans, tumor markers and we will send referral to our Hepatobiliary surgery department for immediate review.
  
- ◆ Medical History
  - \_\_\_ Office / clinic notes (please include diagnosis, medical history, complications of liver disease, current medications with dosage, allergies)
  
- ◆ Liver Biopsy Report (if done)
  
- ◆ Information on history of alcohol and/or drug abuse with dates of documented sobriety and any screens done. Information on history of tobacco use. All patients with a history of alcohol and/or drug abuse MUST produce 6 months of documented negative screens.
  
- ◆ PCP will need to provide an out of network referral if applicable.
  
- ◆ Any additional information you may consider pertinent such as x-ray reports, etc.

**The above information is requested by our transplant hepatologists to help expedite the process of determining your patient's disposition for the possibility of liver transplantation in the future. Review of this material prior to the patient's examination can help us screen those who do not appear suitable or require additional work-up to better define complicating problems. All of these studies can be organized at our center as well but this may result in some delays that can impact those individuals with more advanced disease. We appreciate your cooperation in making the system as efficient as possible so that we can optimize the care of our patients.**
